A. Administrative Matters:

Action taken report for PRC held on 27th Oct 2020 was presented to all members.

B. Academic Matters:

Item No. B1:

1. Review of programme structure of MBA (HHM) Programme

Discussion:

The stakeholder's feedback analysis & COPO mapping for MBA (HHM) programme were discussed & deliberated. There were no major suggestions for curriculum, COPO mapping & programme structure.

Resolution No. B1: PRC: 26.03.2021

Resolved to continue the existing programme structure of MBA-HHM (Batch 2022-24) & propose to BoS & Academic council for further approval.

2. Review of programme structure of M.Sc. Medical Technology

Discussion:

The COPO mapping of M.Sc. MT programme was deliberated during PRC and the PRC Members suggested no modifications. Feedback analysis from stakeholders – students, alumni, faculty & industry was discussed, however there were no major changes suggested for curriculum.

Course in 'Telemedicine Technology' was added in the program structure of MSc MT program (Batch 2020-22 & 2021-23 batches) & the Dissertation course credits were changed to 3 credits.

Resolution No. B2: PRC: 26.03.2021

- Resolved to accept the modification of addition of 'Telemedicine Technology' course in the programme structures for MSc MT 2020-22 & 2021-23.
- b. Resolved to continue with the upgraded programme structure of MSc MT Batch 2022-24 with addition of Course in 'Telemedicine Technology' for further approval process by BoS & Academic Council.

3. Review of programme structure of Master of Public Health

Discussion:

The following modifications were proposed:

- 1. The feedback analysis from stakeholders suggested no changes & continued to have present programme structure. However addition of current topics on Global Health to be introduced.
- 2. Recommended to incorporate the Global Health Diplomacy replacing the existing semester 4 course on Global Health.
- 3. To reduce the credits for Internship course from 10 to 5 credits & call it as Summer Internship Programme (5 credits) & shift the course from 4th Semester into 3rd semester.
- 4. To introduce a course on Project with 5 credits in 4th semester.

New course proposal: Global Health Diplomacy - 2 credits

We propose to include this new course in the curriculum for the fourth semester of the MPH programme for the following reasons:

- 1) To help the public health students critically analyse the role of diplomacy in an evolving Global health sector
- 2) To understand the importance of global health diplomacy to advance the Sustainable Development Goals, which are an essential learning in public health.

While developing this new 2-credit course in Global Health Diplomacy, suggestions & feedback were obtained from the Diplomats & experts working with WHO.

Resolution No. B3: PRC: 26.03.2021

- a. Resolved to forward the Global Health Diplomacy 2 credits course to Public Health sub-committee for developing & approving the course content and including in course catalogue of FoHS.
- b. Resolved to incorporate the course on Global Health Diplomacy & modification in Internship courses as Summer Internship Programme in 3rd semester & Project in 4th semester in the MPH (Batch 2021-23) programme.
- c. To consider the modifications & approve the program structure for MPH (Batch 2022-24) & proposed to BoS & Academic council for further approval.

4. Review of programme structure of M.Sc. Nutrition and Dietetics

Discussion:

Stakeholders Feedback of each of the Masters programme -

The stakeholder feedback analysis is in the process. Based on the inputs and suggestions, modifications could be considered and the necessary actions will be pursued.

COPO attainment of each of the Masters programme -

We propose to continue the existing COPO for the upcoming batch of MSc ND. The analysis of COPO attainment is in progress. Further actions to be considered after completion of the same.

Modifications in course chronology of programme structure -

We propose to bring forward the Biostatistics course to the first semester from the second semester and to delete the course on Food microbiology. The contents of Food Microbiology course to be incorporated to Food quality and Safety and Laboratory Techniques I courses.

Modifications in the course content -

Review of programme structure of M.Sc. Nutrition and Dietetics

a. Genomics, Proteomics and Bioinformatics - 3 credits

We propose to modify the content to suit the nutrigenomics specialization requirements. A few topics could be reduced to match the scope of specialization. Based on the student and faculty feedback the contents could be modified.

b. Lifestyle Disease Management - 3 credits

We propose the upgradation of the existing lifestyle Disease Management course to include relevant emerging areas and new topics.

c. Food Quality & Safety - 3 credits

We propose to upgrade the content of the course and addition of a few topics on food microbiology to compensate the deletion of food microbiology course.

New course development proposed to BoS sub-committee

To comply with the requirements of the choice based credit system we propose the incorporation of two electives in the M.Sc. Nutrition and Dietetics programme structure. The proposed two electives include Food systems & Entrepreneurship in the Food Industry as 2-credit elective courses. The aforementioned changes were proposed based on the feedback of Industry experts and students. Food System is an emerging area in the nutrition domain that emphasises the interrelationship between agriculture, nutrition and health. An elective on Entrepreneurship in the Food industry would equip students with skills to support setting up of individual enterprises after their master's programme.

To accommodate the introduction of the electives, the course on Food Microbiology was deleted and the course on Laboratory Techniques I, and Food Quality and Safety were strengthened with the additional topics relevant to Food Microbiology including the practical section.

New course proposal:

a. Food system - 2 credits

Discussion:

Food system is an upcoming area that connects Agriculture, Nutrition and Health, which is going to transform the area of Nutrition and Dietetics. Industry experts suggested including the course in the programme structure. We propose the same as an elective.

b. Laboratory Technique I - 3 credits

Discussion:

We propose to update the contents with the addition of new topics for practical training with inclusion of more biochemistry and microbiology contents to improve the analytical skill development of students.

All these changes are proposed for M.Sc. ND (Batch 2021-23 & 2022-24).

 New specialization Food Safety and Quality Management: New proposed specialization in Food Safety and Quality Management, which was deferred due to COVID situation, is proposed to be offered from the Batch 2022-24.
