





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SYMPSYCH 2025 Conference will focus on the theme "Navigating the Paradigms – Mental Health to Behavioral Health Sciences; Classroom to Community; Illness to Wellness", creating a platform for dialogue and collaboration to explore the intersections between behavioural health, education, and community well-being.

SYMPSYCH 2025 will address three key paradigms.

- 1. **Mental health to Behavioral health**, expanding the scope to include behaviours, emotions, and cognitive processes that influence overall well-being.
- 2. From Classroom to Community, emphasizing the importance of bridging educational settings with real-world applications to promote collective well-being.

SYMPSYCH 2025 will begin with four parallel pre-conference workshops on key topics such as psychological first aid, setting up mental health services in schools, positive parenting, and expressive therapeutic techniques for healing.

After the workshops, a plenary session will be conducted. This will be followed by two parallel tracks. Track I will focus on the theme "Care Beyond Cure: Behavioral Science for Holistic Wellbeing." Track II will address the theme "Education in Action: Bridging the Classroom and Community". The second day of the conference will include oral and poster presentations, followed by the inaugural ceremony, keynote addresses, plenary sessions, symposiums, and panel discussions focused on key trends related to the conference theme. The event will conclude with a valedictory session.

The conference will underscore the importance of creating research that expands beyond the limited scope of "mental health." It will highlight the need for research that bridges theoretical curricula with practical applications, ensuring that educational insights are translated into tangible benefits for community well-being. Moreover, there will be a focus on shifting research priorities from the traditional illness model to a broader understanding that includes well-being, resilience, and proactive health strategies. This shift is essential for developing more effective, holistic solutions that address the full spectrum of human health and wellness.







About Pune and How to Reach



Pune, often called the "Oxford of the East," is a dynamic city in Maharashtra that blends a rich historical legacy with modern progress. Known for its prestigious educational institutions and thriving IT and business hubs, Pune is a centre for intellectual exchange and innovation. The city enjoys pleasant weather in September and October, with lush greenery and a scenic backdrop as the monsoon recedes. Historical landmarks like Shaniwar Wada and Aga Khan Palace showcase Pune's cultural depth, while its proximity to the Western Ghats offers serene escapes. The city's culinary scene ranges from traditional Maharashtrian flavours to global cuisines. Pune is a bustling metropolis with an estimated population of about 7 million spread over 138 sq. km. It is situated at an altitude of 559 meters above sea level. It has been ranked as one of the most liveable cities in India several times. The temperatures range from 15° C to 35° C with an average rainfall of 68 cm. Pune is well connected with the National Highways and Express Highways leading to Mumbai, Bangalore, Hyderabad, Ahmedabad, and other major cities. Pune railway junction has connectivity with almost all parts of the country. Pune International Airport provides air connectivity to all major airports in India.







About SIU, Lavale









Lavale is a picturesque village located on the outskirts of Pune, Maharashtra, known for its lush green landscapes, rolling hills, and serene environment. Just about 20 km from Pune city.

Symbiosis – Lavale campus is rich in scenic ambience, spread across 350 acres having biodiversity in nature with two bandhas (water storage reservoirs) of total storage capacity of about 30,00,000 litres of freshwater and home to more than 191 species of birds, butterflies, reptiles, amphibians and mammals. The University has developed three butterfly gardens and saplings of more than 200 food plants and nectar plants. Around 40 species of butterflies and many types of moth species are seen on the campus. Lavale offers a perfect blend of natural beauty and modern development, making it an ideal location for educational institutions, research centres, and residential communities.

How to reach Symbiosis International University (Deemed University), Hill-Base campus, Lavale

Symbiosis International University's Lavale Campus, located in the scenic hills near Pune, is accessible by air, rail, and road, making it convenient for both international and domestic visitors. For international travellers, Pune International Airport (PNQ) is approximately 22 km away, with taxis and rideshare options taking 45 minutes to an hour. Those arriving via Mumbai's Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj International Airport can reach Pune by a 3-4 hour road journey or a short domestic flight. Domestic travellers can also arrive at Pune Junction Railway Station, 20 km from the campus, or via intercity buses to Swargate or Shivajinagar bus stands. From these hubs, taxis, app-based rides, or private vehicles can take you to the campus. For road travellers, the campus is 19 km west of Pune city centre, accessible via Paud Road or NH48, with clear signage directing to Lavale Village. Once on campus, the reception or security staff will assist with navigation.
